Announcing our Interim Pastors

The Session is very pleased to announce that Rev. Beverly Bullock and Rev. Sylvester Bullock have been hired to be our interim co-pastors starting August 1, 2024. While we have been blessed to have them worshipping with us, they were chosen after much prayer and a search that included interviews with two other pastors who had been recommended to us by Presbytery.

Bev and Sly are retired Presbyterian ministers who have vast ministry experience shepherding congregations in West Virginia and Virginia and have served as Interim Pastors in several other communities. They have had specific training in doing Interim Pastor ministry which is a particular area of ministry training. In addition, Bev has worked as a hospital chaplain and Sly has specialized in music education.

In retirement, they moved to Pullman to be with children and grandchildren. Since arriving on the Palouse, they have become members of the Inland Northwest Presbytery and have been actively involved in ministry activities. They have been interim pastors for the Community Presbyterian Church in St. Maries and Bev preaches once a month at Grace Community Church in Potlatch. In June, Sly will represent our Presbytery at the General Assembly, which will take place in Salt Lake City, Utah.

As co-pastors, Bev and Sly will each preach, serve communion and moderate Session meetings. Bev will take the lead on staff and administrative issues and Sly will continue to lead our music ministry. Each will also be available for pastoral counseling and care to our members and others. They feel deeply called to walk with us during this interim period and have committed to be in this role until we call a permanent pastor.

Pastor Nominating Committee Update

At a called congregational meeting on May 5, the congregation voted to approve the following nominees to serve on the Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC): Bruce Pitman (chair), Beth Case, Sarah Dossey, Amy Pendegraft, and Jacob Wells. The PNC is beginning the process of preparing a Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP), which will describe our church, community, and pastoral needs. Our recent Mission Study Report will serve as the basis for much of this profile. Once the MDP is completed and approved by Presbytery, it will be posted on PC(USA)'s Church Leadership Connection website where our profile will be matched with profiles of appropriate pastoral candidates.



The typical pastor search process takes about a year. As the Pastor Nominating Committee does its work, we can support them through our prayers and encouragement.



I'd like to end my Family Ministry summer newsletter piece by talking a little bit about June's newest official holiday. Juneteenth is not a holiday that was part of my culture or upbringing, although it has been celebrated for over a hundred years in some parts of the country. It's a bittersweet holiday because it celebrates freedom, but it also reminds us that we can deny others their freedom and impose unfair laws and limits on them.

In Luke 4:14-21, we hear that Jesus came to be the antidote to this kind of wrong treatment. Quoting the prophet Isaiah, Jesus says in verse 18 that God's Spirit "anointed me to preach good news to the poor...to proclaim freedom for the prisoners and recovery of sight for the blind, to release the oppressed." That sounds very much like the message of Juneteenth, and we still have work to do to join him with good news for the poor, freedom for prisoners and help for the oppressed. May Jesus bring us the joy of freedom and help us not to be blind to the difficult experiences of many people in our community and beyond.
