Peace and Global Witness Offering

Presbyterian Church (USA)'s Peace and Global Witness special offering is almost upon us. We will dedicate our offering Sunday October 6th, on World Communion Sunday.

Peacemaking is central to the gospel and the mission of the Church. In Zechariah 8:12 we are asked to sow the seeds of peace. This offering addresses systems of injustice in our own communities and around the world. Faith is a verb; if we all do a little, it adds up to a lot. For inspirational stories of hope, healing, and justice to improving the safety, health, and economic stability of individuals here in the US and abroad visit Presbyterian Special Offerings - Peace & Global Witness (pcusa.org).

Twenty-five percent of our offering is retained locally for use in our community. Session approved that 25% of our gifts go to Oxford House. They just reopened their men's home (with many needs for operating expenses) and have planned a Women's home to open in 2025. Oxford Houses offer a supportive way of living and opportunities to learn skills in an alcohol and drug-free environment.

An additional 25% of our offering is joined with other midcouncil churches to support regional needs, and 50% supports the work for peace and reconciliation by Presbyterians around the globe.

Coats for Vandals

The Center would like to invite you to participate in the Coats for Vandals program at the University of Idaho. In partnership with the International Programs Office (IPO), Association of Students at the University of Idaho (ASUI), and the Student Sustainability Cooperative (SSC), The Center is collecting donations of winter clothing (coats, scarves, gloves, beanies, etc.) from September 15 through 30.

We are aiming to collect 100 coats and 100 accessories to distribute to students, scholars and their families at the Fall Coat Drive being held on October 2nd at The Center (822 Elm St) from 2-4pm. Clothing can be dropped off at The Center during our open hours of 7am-4pm Monday through Friday in front of the office on the main floor.



We are also looking for volunteers to help with the event: working at the tables to help students find appropriately sized clothing, help with set-up/tear-down, and sorting the donations into totes. Students will be able to pick out 1 coat and 1 accessory.

Pastor Nominating Committee Report

The Pastor Nominating Committee (PNC) has completed a major task which will enable our search process to move forward. The PNC has created the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP), which is essentially the advertisement for our pastor vacancy, in the format that is needed for the PCUSA personnel hiring system. This information allows prospective candidates to view our vacancy and learn about our congregation and our community.



With Session approval, we submitted our Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP) to Presbytery and it was approved by the Committee on Ministry on September 10th. We will enter this information into the Presbyterian (PCUSA) online personnel system and begin advertising the position.

Your Pastor Nominating Committee used the excellent Mission Study Report which was written last spring as the primary source of information for the Ministry Discernment Profile (MDP). The MDP has a fairly rigid format which limits the amount of information that can be

submitted, so we had to summarize major issues. This document is simply the beginning of an information exchange with potential candidates.

Members of the Pastor Nominating Committee thoroughly studied the Mission Study Report, completed Presbytery training, gathered other information about our community and then created responses to the various sections of this profile. We are grateful for those who gave input into the Mission Study Report and to those who helped to create this document.

We are optimistic that we will be able to begin advertising our position within a few weeks. Once we begin receiving application materials, we will prayerfully review materials which will include resumes, statements of faith and sample sermons. We will also conduct zoom interviews and make contacts with references. We will then conduct in-person interviews with people who seem to be a good fit. It is difficult to estimate the length of this process because we don't how many people may apply or anything about their circumstances. We are eager to begin engaging with people who are exploring the possibility of being called to this pulpit.

Please pray for this process and for people whom we have not yet met.






FPC shared a table with The Center at the August 2024 Palouse Pride Festival. Free compliments were given to guests.
