## **HEARING ASSISTANCE SYSTEM UPGRADE**

We are installing a new hearing assistance system that works with Bluetooth-enabled hearing aids or ear buds through Bluetooth and your cell phone. We are still in the process of testing the system and would appreciate having a couple of volunteers come in during this week to try it out and help us get it adjusted. If you would like to hear the sermon or other spoken parts of the service a little better, we encourage you to give the new system a try. In order to access the system through your personal device (cell phone), users will need to download the **WaveCAST app** ahead of time from the Apple App Store for iOS devices or Google Play Store

for Android devices. Be sure the app matches the logo shown here. There are many choices offered by different companies. You will also need access to the church's WI-FI network, but you will need to be in the building to set up that connection (see Julie or Kathy). Matthew will also have a couple of receivers with headphones to loan out. We can set up a training session, if needed. Talk to Kathy if you're interested.
